



It is the only national university in Oita. It plays the role of the region's "knowledge base" in education, research and healthcare. The university has five graduate schools centered around five department, and a university hospital. As of November 2016, there were 52 international students from 22 countries and regions. The university also has an academic exchange agreement with 82 universities and hospitals in 22 countries and regions.

International students are provided with dormitories, and thorough Japanese language education is given at the "Japanese Language Research CENTER". International students utilize the advantages Beppu has an "international city of hot spring tourism" to acquire traditional Japanese culture and international business skills at the university and play vital roles in Japan and abroad after graduation. While expertise is honed in both the faculty of Engineering and the Faculty of Business & Economics, the university provides close support so that international students can have a fulfilling campus life, through opportunities for experiencing Japanese culture, joint events with Japanese students and local events to improve language skills, and cultural exchange experiences. It also has scholarships for privately funded international students, which are awarded according to exam results to waive tuition fees. It also offers a special Japanese language course for mastering the Japanese language required for studying at the university.

The university's philosophy is "To nurture independent and self-sufficient human resources", and aims to nurture internationally-minded people. Many international students are taking the International Business Course, Japanese Language Education Course and Food & Nutrition Sciences Course for International Students. The curricula are focused on "practical studies" for the improvement of Japanese language skills and real life application through Japanese culture experiences and a variety of exchange activities.

Oita College (AKA Oita Kosen) was established in 1963 after the Colleges of Technology System was introduced and is a 5-year college that fosters practical engineers. It holds a Japan Accreditation Board for Engineering Education (JABEE) certification and educates internationally gualified engineers. The campus is situated in Akeno Daichi, about 15 minutes drive from the center of Oita City, and students living in the dormitories enjoy their studies and sports in a comfortable living environment.

Oita's international student support

Oita provides a variety of support for international students.

There is a non-profit organization, "University Consortium Oita", which provides comprehensive support, and industries, educational institutions and administration work together to support international students.

Oita Scholarship Fund for Privately Funded **International Students**

Oita has its own scholarship fund and provides 30,000yen a month each to 80 privately funded international students. It is awarded to provide a good environment in which privately funded international students can engage with their communities while focusing on their studies. Scholarship students are given opportunities for deepening their understanding about Oita through lectures and experiences themed on the prefecture's nature, history, industries and tourism.







University Consortium Oita

A non-profit organization comprised of universities, junior colleges, vocational schools and technical colleges and various business groups, including administrative bodies and chambers of commerce of Oita. It provides a variety of support, from start to finish, for international students living in Oita.

It provides support for daily life, and programs for interacting with local people.

Students can engage in many local events, including Japanese speech contents, "language lessons" led by international student teachers, "cooking lessons" and "cross-cultural understanding lessons".

Places for getting involved in the community

It runs a matching site called "International Students Talent Bank of Oita - ACTIVE-NET" which provides information about part time jobs for utilising the abilities of international students, including interpretation and translation jobs for international students, language lecturer jobs, business assistant jobs and paid internships.

Employment and business start-up support

It also provides support for students seeking employment in Japan. It offers company tours, corporate orientation meetings, various seminars for job hunting, social gathering between businesses and international students, and consultation meetings for changing the status of residence on visas.

For international students seeking to start a business, it provides support through entrepreneurship courses, seminars and consultation meetings, and students can also use its Incubation Facility for international students.
